Joe's Jots

Last Sunday. We had a wonderful All-In-One a week ago. Over 450 were present for worship, and a large crowd stayed for lunch. The singing was soul-stirring. (If you didn't feel something during the "hallelujahs" of the song *A Shield About Me*, check your pulse!) And **Kirk Brothers** preached three phenomenal lessons. He offered this challenge: "It's time for the church to get up from our comfortable padded pews and get out of our climate-controlled buildings and share the good news of Jesus with the world." I hope we will allow his challenge to change us into bold disciples. If you want to listen to Kirk's messages again, they are available on our website and podcast.

Charlottesville. A couple weeks ago on Sunday night, I preached about when the early Christian leader Philip baptized an Ethiopian eunuch. This man was from an ancient African kingdom. He was dark complected, a black man. Last weekend in Charlottesville, Virginia, several hate groups gathered—people who proclaim that the white race is better than the others. Nothing could be more antithetical to the gospel. Philip understood that from the beginning, the good news of Christ was for all people, red and yellow, black and white. When that Ethiopian rose up from the waters of baptism, he was every part my brother in Christ. To believe otherwise is to embrace a doctrine that doesn't come from God but from Satan.

Several have expressed concern with how young the racist protestors were. I've heard things like, "I thought all the racists would have died out by now." But the truth is sin never takes a generation off. We must continually stand up against the sins of racism, sexual immorality, greed, the shedding of innocent blood, pride, and so forth. Until evil meets its end at Christ's return, our war against it constantly rages on.
